Press Release: Teaneck Creek Conservancy Receives Franklin Parker Conservation Excellence Grant

Teaneck, NJ October 2020 - The Teaneck Creek Conservancy, a member-supported nonprofit dedicated to the protection and reclamation of a 46 acre eco-art park in Teaneck, NJ, received a 2020 Franklin Parker Community Conservation Grant from the New Jersey Conservation Foundation in the amount of \$4000. The grant program is aimed at providing essential resources to nonprofit organizations addressing environmental challenges and improving quality of life for communities of color throughout New Jersey. With these funds, Teaneck Creek Conservancy will provide Racial Antibias Training for NJ Environmental Centers.

"The purpose of our project is to engage local NJ nature centers in racial nonbias training in order to create an understanding of systemic racism. This training will give their staff and board the resources to create equitable and inclusive natural spaces for people of all races, religions, sexual orientations, and creeds to enjoy, experience, and learn." said Teaneck Creek Conservancy's Executive Director Alexa Fantacone.
